

BIOGRAPHY

- In 1970, first played high school basketball (grade 12) at Eastwood C.I. in Kitchener.
- In 1971, high school team won city championship and Ontario provincial championship. Romel was named MVP.
- Played at Penn State from 1972 to 1975.
- Played with Canadian national team from 1974 to 1976, under Jack Donohue.
- Played at Olympics in 1976 (Montreal) where team finished fourth.
- From 1976 to 1978, played for Forli in professional league (Italy, Division One).
- Played for Team Canada in 1979 to 1980. National team qualified for Moscow Olympics but Canada boycotted.
- Played at the University of Calgary in 1979.
- Played professionally for Caracas (Venezuela, Division One) in 1980.
- Played in Division One Senior Men's league in Calgary from 1981 to 1991 where team won numerous city championships.
- Played for Canadian national team in 1983 to 1984. Team Canada qualified for 1984 Olympics where team finished fourth.
- Played for Canadian national team in 1987 to 1988. Team Canada qualified for 1988 Olympics where team finished sixth.
- In 1988, officially retired from playing international basketball.
- Romel played in numerous Pan American Games and World Championships.
- Inducted into Canadian Basketball Hall of Fame in 1996.
- The 1976 Senior Men's Olympic Team was inducted into the Canadian Basketball Hall of Fame in 2007.
